

LUIGI CARBONE

A member of the Board of the Italian Regulatory Authority for Electricity and Gas since February 2011.

Born in Naples on 1st December 1964, graduated in Law at the Naples University with honours and plaudits from the Examiners.

From 1987 to 1992, after winning a competitive exam as Parliamentary Arbitrator, worked with the Italian Senate “Studies Service”.

In 1992, won a competitive exam as Member of the Council of State (*Consiglio di Stato* i.e. the highest administrative court in Italy).

In 2010, was appointed as Divisional President of the *Consiglio di Stato*.

Between 1992 and 2010, served in a number of positions i.e. as legal advisor, legislative affairs manager, private secretary to the Italian Prime Minister’s Office, and in particular to the Legal and Legislative Affairs dept. (DAGL), the Civil Service dept., the EU Policies dept. and the Institutional Reforms dept.

Vice-coordinator of the Unit on Regulatory Simplification from 1999 to 2002; on behalf of the Prime Minister’s Office, acted as liaison officer with the Vice-President of the European Convention Giuliano Amato (2002-2004).

From 2005 to 2007, was Secretary General with delegated functions on behalf of the *Consiglio di Stato*.

Vice Secretary General of the Italian Prime Minister’s Office from 2007 to 2011; for a number of Governments terms of office, received delegated functions for regulatory simplification, coordinated the Unit on Simplification and Quality of Regulation and was also head of the Task Force in support of the Ministry for Regulatory Simplification.

At EU level, was in charge of the Italian initiative for the project “Maastricht for Public Administration”, participated in the “Mandelkern Group on better regulation” and currently represents Italy at the High Level Group on Better Regulation of the European Commission.

Since 2009, has been Vice President of Regulatory Policy Committee at the OCDE.

Reference lecturer of the French ENA (National School of Administration) – the first non-French *Membre du jury* on career advancement (*promotion*) for access to the highest level of the French Civil Service (*haute fonction publique*). Currently teaches at the Bruges College of Europe and was a member of the Scientific Committee with EIPA (European Institute of Public Administration) of Maastricht.

Holds a Professorship in Administration Studies and Administrative and Regulatory Impact Assessment, and is also a member of the Scientific Committee of the Post-Graduate Course in Public Management and Public Communication at the Rome LUMSA University.

Gives lectures at the Post-Graduate Course in “Parliament and Public Policies” at the Rome LUISS university and the School of Legislation Studies of the ISLE (Institute for Legislative Documentation and Studies).

He is the author of several published papers on the administrative action, the quality of regulation, the State Administration reform and regulatory simplification; among other functions and positions held, is co-editor of the magazine *Urbanistica e appalti* (Spatial Planning and Procurement Contracts) and is also a member of the Scientific Committee for the following magazines and bulletins: *Giornale di diritto amministrativo* (administrative law), *Giustizia amministrativa* (administrative justice), *Rivista trimestrale di diritto processuale amministrativo* (administrative procedural law), *Rivista del diritto processuale dell’esecuzione* (enforcement procedural law), *Rivista di diritto sanitario* (medical law).

He collaborates with *Il Corriere Giuridico*, a periodical on legal matters published by IPSOA (Post-Graduate Institute of Business Administration Studies) and is the author of numerous papers published on the magazines *Foro italiano*, *Foro amministrativo*, *Documenti Giustizia*, *Corriere Giuridico* and *Giornale di diritto amministrativo*.
